FROM THE DESK OF BRO. WADE

Recently the Arkansas Democrat-Gazette printed articles from two people concerning their relationship with the Southern Baptist Convention. One wrote of the reasons she left the SBC while the other gave his reasons for staying within the SBC tent. Their perspectives caused me to reflect on why I am a Southern Baptist.

I am a Southern Baptist because our official doctrinal confession of faith affirms the inspiration, inerrancy, sufficiency, and authority of the Holy Bible. It affirms the creation of man in God's image (male and female), his fall into sin, and his need for a Savior. It also affirms the deity, humanity, Lordship, and substitutionary atonement and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It affirms that salvation is by grace through faith in Jesus Christ which results in justification, sanctification, and glorification for

the believer. It affirms that the indwelling Holy Spirit guides man into all truth and guides him into holiness. It affirms the bodily, visible, and glorious return of Christ for His followers and His final judgment of all humanity.

I am also a Southern Baptist because our doctrinal statement and governing documents affirm the autonomy of each local church. This means each congregation can choose to cooperate in local, state, national, and international mission causes and offerings as it sees fit. This also means that no denominational entity or employee can override the desires of a local church.

I am a Southern Baptist because I believe the Cooperative Program is the best way to fund missions, evangelism, and theological education. I may not always agree with some decisions made by denominational leaders, but the CP gives me the opportunity to engage in obeying the Great Commission at home and around the world.

I am a Southern Baptist because we have a specific vision guiding us into 2025. This plan was approved by the messengers of the SBC at last year's convention in Nashville, TN. We are praying and working in six specific areas:

- 1. Increase IMB field missionaries by a net of 500.
- 2. Plant 1500 new churches in North America.
- 3. Increase CP giving to at least \$500 million a year.
- 4. Pray that God would call out new pastors, staff members, and missionaries to do the work of the ministry.
- 5. Increase our number of children and youth baptisms.
- 6. Irradicate all sexual abuse and racism from our churches.

Some might say these are unreachable. They may be difficult to achieve, but through prayer and diligence they can be met.

Let me be clear. My first allegiance is to the Lord Jesus Christ and His kingdom! Right now, I believe Southern Baptist's offer the best way of serving Him and sharing His Good News with the world. So, I'll be a Southern Baptist until the day I no longer believe this convention offers that "best way."

BEECH SPRINGS CAMP

It is spring at camp! Hummingbirds, bumble bees, and lavender wisteria make for a glorious, eye-full! Spring also means summer is near, and we begin to prepare for our campers! There is much to do in preparation.

The pool has to be cleaned out and prepared for use. This is a major undertaking and requires about three full days just to get clean. The big pecan tree beside the pool gives us lots of shade, but it sheds its leaves into the pool requiring a lot of clean up. Then we start the water-chemical balancing process that takes about three more days to perfect if the pump is willing to work another year.



The ropes course has to be cleared and cleaned up too. Every year an inspector comes to check the course and we adjust the various parts of the ropes course as needed. All the gear must undergo a thorough examination to pass inspection which takes another three to four days.



The pond needs work every spring to cut back the bushes and undergrowth so folks can walk around the pond. The dock needs re-painting, and the equipment shed needs a little work. Recently a family of beavers moved in, and they have the spillway half blocked, raising the pond water level about 6 inches. We need to remove the blockage and figure out how to run off the beavers!

Most cabins are ready to go and only need freshening up, but a couple of them need minor repairs. All cabins need the leaves and limbs blown off their roofs. Hot water heaters and air conditioners will be checked to ensure all systems are in working order. Numbers for this year's camps are starting to come in, and it looks like a very full summer. We need all our cabins 100% operational.
